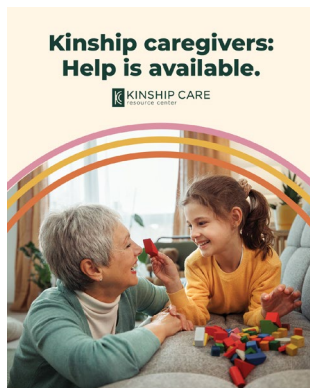


KCRC Toolkit – Social Posts

POST #2: REASONS FOR KINSHIP CARE



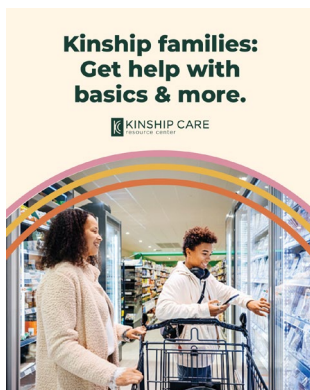
